"Celebration can be devoid of any significant appreciation of what was involved in that movement. We can become partisan idolaters, for celebration may be little more than an expression of loyalty to certain traditions. If we are to honor God, our remembrance will proceed from profound gratitude to Him for the light that shown in the midst of darkness, and for the emancipation that occurred when the Reformers were cut loose from shackles of superstition and idolatry.

"We fail to accord to the Reformers our debt of gratitude when we cease to prize our heritage. But far greater is the sin of failing to give praise to God." (John Murray)


